Anthony L. Gardner was the U.S. Ambassador to the European Union. He was sworn in on February 18, 2014 and left his post on January 20, 2017.

Before becoming U.S. ambassador to the EU, Gardner was managing director for six years at Palamon Capital Partners, a private equity firm based in London. He was also a director of one of the finance departments of Bank of America and GE Capital and International Acquisition Director in GE International, all based in London. Anthony also worked with international law firms in London, Paris, New York and Brussels.

Anthony has spent more than twenty years working on EEUU-Europe relations as public servant, lawyer and investor. Gardner served as Director for European Affairs on the National Security Council in 1994-95 and during that time he worked closely on US Mission to the European Union to launch the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership, or T-TIP that will position our economies for success in the 21st century.

Before that he worked with the Treuhandanstalt (German Privatization Ministry) in Berlin, with the Stock Exchange Operations Committee in Paris and as secondee for the European Commission in Brussels. He is author of "A New Era in US-EU Relations?", "The Clinton Administration and the New Transatlantic Agenda" and various articles on EU matters.

He is also a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, and has served as trustee of the Guggenheim UK Charitable Trust, and a board member for the Peggy Guggenheim Collection in Venice.

Anthony has been educated at Harvard University, Oxford University, Columbia Law School and London Business School and is fluent in French, Italian and Spanish. He also speaks German.
